Public Health Outcomes Framework Update

The latest update to the <u>Public Health Outcomes Framework</u> has just been published by Public Health England, including data up to 2012/13 for many indicators. The Framework contains a range of indicators covering:

- Overarching health (e.g. life expectancy)
- The wider determinants of health (e.g. education, employment, housing)
- Health improvement (e.g. smoking, physical activity)
- Health protection (e.g. vaccination)
- Healthcare and premature mortality (e.g. hospital emergency readmission)

What does this mean for Richmond?

Life Expectancy

• The difference in life expectancy at birth between the least and most deprived areas in Richmond is 6.8 years for males and 3.9 years for females (mid-range for London)

Wider Determinants of Health

- 64.1% of adults with a learning disability live in stable and appropriate accommodation (below the London average of 68.1%)
- The rates of homelessness acceptances (4.1 per thousand) and households in temporary accommodation (3.0 per thousand) were lower than the London averages (4.6 and 11.9 per thousand respectively)

Health Improvement

- There were about 20 conceptions per thousand 15-17 year-olds and 3 conceptions per thousand 13-15 year-olds in 2012 (similar to the London average)
- The rate of hospital admissions caused by unintentional and deliberate injuries in children aged 0-4 years was 111.2 per 10,000, which is similar to the London average
- The average "difficulties score" for all 5-16 year-old looked-after children was 13.1, which is better than the London average of 13.5 (scores below 14 are classed as "normal")
- Richmond has the third lowest rate of alcohol-related hospital admissions in London (431 per 100,000). Although this rate is a slight increase from the previous year, other indicators suggest that, after past year on year increases, alcohol related

admissions may be falling overall (see the recent <u>JSNA Newsflash on Local Alcohol Profiles for England</u> for more detail)

• The rate of injuries due to falls in people is similar to the London average for 65-79 year-olds (1,039 per 100,000) and better than the London average for over-80s (4,913 per 100,000)

Health Protection

 Richmond is top in London for proportion of NHS organisations with a boardapproved sustainable development management plan (75%)

Healthcare and Premature Mortality

- Infant mortality is at 2.7 per thousand, which is fifth lowest in London
- The rate of emergency readmissions within 30 days of discharge from hospital is 11.6% (similar to London average)
- The rate of hip fractures in people aged 65 and over is similar to the London average
